Community Classrooms: More Than Book Stuff

At Pivot Point Learning Centres, our Community Classrooms are so much more than a traditional classroom.

One reason why the "bricks & morter" schools don't work for many neurodiverse learners, is that they run on a rigid schedule that focuses on groups and grades. Neurodiversity often means that a student simply needs more time or individual attention in order to be successful. The large schools have very little tolerance for "waiting for one student to be ready" as there just isn't time in the day. This leads to frustration, defeat, anxiety and ultimately depression in many neurodiverse students.

For example, did you know that the famed actor, Henry Winkler was diagnosed at the age of 31 with Dyslexia? It wasn't until his stepson was diagnosed that an "a-ha" moment occurred when Henry realized there was a name related to the many challenges he faced trying to learn as a child at the same age. It became clear to him that, "how you learn has nothing to do with how brilliant you are." Henry Winkler on <u>Dyslexia</u>.

Pivot Point Learning Centres are designed to meet students where they are at. Each class is filled with individual students working at their own pace with other students who are doing the same. The instructors use themes/projects to bring the individuals in the centre together, but each individual student still has their personal goals that they are able to reach when they are ready to do so. We see individual students not "classes" or "grades" of students at Pivot Point.

By letting each student's readiness dictate when they move to the next goal, not the clock on the wall, students begin to build self confidence. Leading them to be receptive to facing challenges and succeeding towards their own personal achievements.
